IAG waives 2022 annual fees for NSMs

In consideration of the difficult period encountered during the COVID-19 pandemic, the IAG decided to waive the 2022 annual fee to our National Scientific Members (NSMs). By easing the financial and administrative burden on our NSMs, we hope that this will contribute to a renewed dynamism in the geomorphological community as we emerge from the worst days of the pandemic. The IAG will ask their NSMs for annual fees again in 2023 under the new executive committee, in the meantime we kindly ask our NSMs to inform us of any changes in their treasurers to keep our records up-to-date.

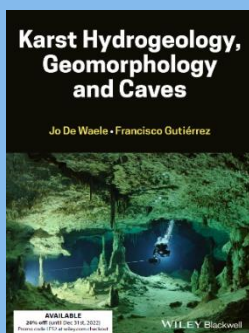
10th IAG ICG Coimbra, Portugal, 12-16 September 2022

The Organizing Committee of the 10th IAG ICG is pleased to announce that in total 700 abstracts have been submitted to the conference. The programme includes two IAG General Assemblies, 25 thematic sessions representing the latest innovations in theoretical, methodological and applied approaches in Geomorphology as well as a number of social- and side events. Several multi-day pre/post-conference and one-day mid-conference field trips such as to the Cape Verde and Azores islands, Serra da Estrela or Lisbon Region etc. are offered around the conference dates. An Intensive Course for Young Geomorphologists on “Geomorphological changes in fire affected landscapes: field and laboratory techniques for soil erosion analysis” will take place after the conference. New book “Karst Hydrogeology, Geomorphology and Caves”

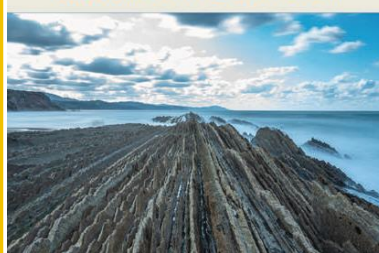

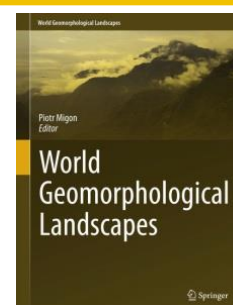

This announcement will kick off an endeavour to designate geological sites from around the world that are iconic, recognized by all geoscience community for their impact in understanding the Earth and its history. The IAG is pleased that three sites suggested by the IAG are included in the first 100 IUGS Geological Heritage Sites. The geographical distribution of the first 100 sites includes 34 sites in America, 28 in Europe, 15 in Africa and 23 sites in Asia/Pacific/Middle East.
