- Thematic session entitled "TS6. Extreme Events, Human Impact and Denudation: Synergistic Effects" at the IAG Regional Conference to be held in Timisoara, Romania (16-18 September 2025). Conveners: Eliza Płaczkowska, Ionela Rachita and Zbigniew Zwoliński. The session includes contribution of 8 oral and 10 poster presentations.

Milica Kašanin-Grubin reported on the progress of work on sediment sample analyses for a joint project between WG Denuchange and WG Badlands members on heavy metal contamination of fluvial sediments in European river valleys.
